Served in 46 th battalion – was injured at Etaples and shipped to England, subsequently discharged as unfit and returned to Sydney in 1917 - see copies of records <i>Son of William Adamthwaite and Mary (Houghton) Born 1896 in Merewether, NSW, Australia, George died in 1927 as a result of his war wounds</i>	
Gordon Benjamin Adamthwaite TEAL line	(source Nat Archives of Australia) service no 6216, enlisted 9 may1916 at Ballarat, Victoria, next of kin father Christopher Adamthwaite, born Waterloo, Vic – see service papers. Served at Etaples, but was returned to England suffering from trench fever. <i>Born ~1894, son of Christopher and Emily (Newling), died 1946</i>	
Harold Adamthwaite YELLOW line	(Source WW1 Campaign Medals) Private in Middlesex Regiment (no 265829) <i>Son of Charles and Celia (Gordge) born 1898, died 1985</i>	
H Appleby Not known	Private in Labour Company, 713 th Btn, (no 419008) attached to Machine Gun corps (17 th Btn) recorded in records of servicemen from 51 st Field Ambulance as admitted to hospital on 26 jan 1919 suffering from scabies. Roman Catholic	
Henry Thomas Adamthwaite YELLOW line	(source WW1 pension docs) injured and (WWI Campaign Medals) Gunner in Royal Garrison Artillery (no 51526) Enlisted 9 nov 1914 age 23 occ French polisher. Gave next of kin as brother Frederick James of New Cross and wife Dora of Southall [height 5' 8¾ weight 140lbs, chest 36½] <i>Son of James and Louisa (Weston), Acc to death cert he was born 7 apr 1890 and died 1972</i>

John Adamthwaite VIOLET line	(source WW1 pension docs) (source WWI Campaign medals) Driver in Royal Field Artillery (no 127465) Enlisted 30 nov 1915 age 25 , occ postman in Leeds [height 5' 3" , weight 116 lbs, chest 35"] <i>son of William Greenbank and Elizabeth (Carr) born in Leeds in 1890 and died in 1972 – shown right with his wife Maggie and their daughter Rhoda</i>

Served in France and Belgium in 1917 and in the Rebellion in Ireland in 1916. Previous occupation clerk in railway. Height 5'4" chest 35". Next of kin Leana Adamthwaite <i>Son John Alexander and Leeanna (Fairey) born 1894, died 1979</i></p>	
<p>Mark Adamthwaite senior ORANGE line</p>	<p>(source Canadian Archives) Original application was turned down on 5 mar 1915 (insufficiency of height) gave d.o.b. as 2 aug 1872 and said he was a male nurse and a widower. However, he must have appealed against that decision, because another copy of the same form stated he was fit for duty. His service record in 42nd Battalion commenced on 6 Mar 1915 on on 10 jun of that year he sailed for Boulogne. He served as a cook in France until Aug 1917 when he was declared unfit to serve in France and was shipped back to Quebec in Sep 1917 after it was discovered that he was actually born in 1860, not 1872. <i>Son of John Allen Adamthwaite and Eliza (Saynor)</i></p>

Thomas E Adamthwaite OLIVE line	(source WW1 Campaign Medals) Private in West Yorkshire regiment (no 43230) <i>Possibly son of Richard and Mary (Longhorn), born 1897 died 1971</i>	
Thomas Michael Adamthwaite ORANGE line	(source US WWI draft registration) Applied sep 12 1918 Brooklyn NY, occupation asst mechanic, die casting. Gave mother Mary as next of kin and lived at same address as Mark above. <i>Son of Mark Adamthwaite and Mary (Glyn)</i>	
Walter Adamthwaite VIOLET line	(Source WW1 Army Service records) (No 48882) Enlisted 30 may 1917 West Yorks Reg. transferred to 7 th Batt Royal Defence Corps, then 27 th Batt DLS Height 4'10" <i>Son of William Greenbank Adamthwaite and Elizabeth (Carr), born 1892 died 1972 (shown with his first wife Emily (Stockdale)</i>	
William Adamthwaite VIOLET line	(source WW1 Campaign Medals) Private in Royal North Lancashire Regiment (no 36991) <i>This could be the son of William and Martha (Bateson) born 1889, died 1920</i>
